## **Could I Have Had Something To Do With That?**

As we sat around the camp fire listening to the sounds of the African bush, one of our **Send the Light campaigners** had a question that she wanted to ask. We had just finished a grueling schedule of teaching a youth Gospel meeting for the Kaonde tribe. Over several days from sun-up to sun-down, the young men taught the teen boys and the young ladies taught the teen girls. We taught about the God of creation and His Kingdom. We taught about sin entering the world. We shared the love of God and the promise of hope and safety through Jesus Christ. We explained the New Covenant. Then we counted the cost of following Jesus as an individual, as a church family, and as one standing before the throne of judgment. After the final lesson and an invitation to obey the Gospel was given, fourteen students put on their Lord in baptism.

What was our campaigner's question? Referring to those who had been baptized, she asked, "Could I have had something to do with that?" Let's let the Apostle Paul answer her question:

14 But how are they to call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? 15 And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!"

Romans 10:14-15

When we train and send our Send the Light participants to teach the Good News of Jesus Christ to a lost world, not only does the Send the Light campaigner have something to do with those who obey the Gospel, but the senders have something to do with those who obey the Gospel! According to Paul, our mutual participation has everything to do with whether or not someone has the opportunity to hear and respond to the Savior! Even though we've had extreme sadness this past week and a half (Rodger's brother passing, a Haven baby passing, Fortune passing, Mildred passing and then Mildred's cousin getting killed in an auto accident on the way home from the funeral) (and dreary rainy weather to compound our sadness), we've had a bright light on Wednesday when we distributed the rest of the Bibles to the sixteen congregations around Nampango. To show their thank yous, they gave four chickens, a half fifty kg bag of maize, 25 kwatcha, a bag of ground nuts, and a sack of dried berries with large seeds.
