Later, Jenny whispered to me, "Does Tomoe have a Bible?" I said, "No," and she ran to her house to get a Bible of hers to give to Tomoe. Jenny presented the Bible to Tomoe as a birthday present.

We all sang happy birthday to Tomoe on that Sunday, June 12, her real birthday. She accepted a World Bible School study and the Bible and seemed interested that she could get the studies over the internet. We not only sang happy birthday to her with our lips but we sang with our hearts that her spiritual birthday would happen soon. She is going back to her hometown close to Hiroshima, Japan, in two weeks. The seed was planted and the spiritual body worked together like I have never before seen.
