Jesus On Monday – Living Faith in the Workplace: Part 1 Opportunities for Doing Good

In Galatians 6:9-10 the Apostle Paul writes, "And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up. So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith." As an elementary school teacher and a follower of Christ, I try to emulate this teaching in my life. This presents a daily challenge.

A few years ago, I was sitting at my desk after dismissing my students at the end of the school day. In walked one of my students. She had walked half way home, turned around, and come back to the classroom. She sat down right next to me and asked if she could stay and read a library book for a little bit. After a while, I asked her if she wanted me to walk her out front to watch for her mother. She said no, that she was walking home. When I pressed the issue, she said that in the middle of the night, the police had come and taken her mother to jail. A friend of the family came over to watch her and got her ready for school, but she really didn't know who was at her house and who was going to take care of her, or what was going to happen to her mother. Can you imagine the confusion and anxiety she felt that day? School was her safe place, and her teachers were the people she counted on to be there and make her feel safe. Jesus uses us where we are and opens our eyes to the needs of others.

My faith in Christ encourages me to love the students that I encounter. When Shaun walks into my classroom angry and disheveled, or sits quietly wiping tears from his face, I may slip him an encouraging note or give him a friendly pat on the shoulder as I walk by his desk. A smile and a little humor may be just what Mia needs after her math paper blew away in the parking lot. My classroom is a safe haven for kids. I want them to feel loved and safe.

In Luke 18, Christ welcomes small children that were brought to him. He cherished their innocence, genuineness, and trust. I am so blessed to have chosen a vocation that allows me to be blessed by so many children over the years and share their lives from August through May. I hope and pray that all you students, parents and teachers out there have a productive, enjoyable school year.
