A Renewed Call for an Old Command

"You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven."

Matthew 5:43-45a

I lived in Waco in 2015 when a mass shooting took place just one mile from the church where I ministered. The shootout was between rival biker gangs in which nine people were killed. It happened on a Sunday. Heather and I had just finished eating a quick lunch at a nearby restaurant when a policeman came speeding through the parking lot of the shopping center. It was not till later that day when news had spread that we realized what had happened. Waco is a nice Texas community a lot like Abilene. It is highly educated with good schools and Universities. There are many good churches and kind people. As we go about our daily lives it is easy to forget that there is a real battle going on. It is hard to see because it is happening below the surface. When acts of violence and hatred result in loss of life and murder, we know something is wrong. They are reminders of the reality of sin and evil in our world.

Last weekend, Charlottesville was the latest example of the destruction that hatred breeds. Racism and prejudice are wreaking havoc in our country. What is the appropriate response for a Christian? Jesus calls us to respond with radical love and prayer. We need to remember that we are in a spiritual battle everyday. Our behaviors, attitudes, and language need to be daily renewed in the love of Christ. Jesus told his disciples that love is to be the ultimate identity marker of the church (John 13:34-35). It is easy to love those who think, look, and act like we do. What makes our love unique is that we offer it to everyone the same. God's kindness is offered to everyone impartially. The love of Christ reaches beyond all lines that our culture places on us.

One of the keys to keeping this command of Jesus is empathy. Be willing to look at things from someone else's perspective. This takes practice and self-examination. We must admit our own faults and biases in order to see and understand others. Make this a part of your daily prayer life. Ask God to help open your eyes. Pray that you be aware of your own struggles towards others. Where there is sin in your heart, repent so that your life may be in step with the Spirit. Finally, pray regularly for those around you who are difficult and who have hurt you. It is often through our devotion to prayer for others that God transforms us.

Phil and Paula Sullivan have just returned after working with refugees at the Omonia Church of Christ in Athens, Greece. They taught the Bible with Let's Start Talking.

Brian Davis helped lead the 2017 Leadership Conference on Evangelism of the Congregations of Southern Congo, in the city of Lubumbashi, Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) in August. His report is attached to the Missions bulletin board. Churches in the DRC began from limited contact with Christians from South Africa who worked in the mines of DRC and carried out Bible studies after work. The church in Geneva, Switzerland, continued follow-up with French World Bible School. Today their contact with the Brotherhood outside of DRC is very limited due to political instability. As a result of a Community Study also held during the conference, three local pastors were baptized.
