...AND THERE WAS DARKNESS...

For two whole minutes last Monday in a swath across America, there was darkness when the moon totally eclipsed the sun, casting darkness on the Planet Earth. People were mesmerized by this forecasted event, and in great expectation traveled sometimes thousands of miles, living in tents for days, to be at the ultimate viewing area for this wonderful phenomenon.

I could not help marveling at this excitement, and imagining the reaction of the people of the 1st century, in Palestine during Jesus' crucifixion and death--when the earth was darkened for more than three hours!

From noon until three in the afternoon darkness came over all the land. About three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice "Eli, Eli, Iema sabachthani?" (which means 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?') ...

...And when Jesus had cried out again in a loud voice, he gave up his spirit. At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth shook, the rocks split and the tombs broke open. The bodies of many holy people who had died were raised to life. They came out of the tombs after Jesus' resurrection and went into the holy city and appeared to many people.

When the centurion and those with him who were guarding Jesus saw the earthquake and all that had happened, they were terrified, and exclaimed, "Surely he was the Son of God!"

(Matthew 27:45-46, 50-54)

On the radio during the coverage of the eclipse, a commentator reported that an atheist said he hadn't believed in God until he saw the eclipse and he decided then that only God could create such a world! Whether the eclipse would be the thing that convinces you of God's existence or not, certainly the beauty and majesty of the creation and its systematic workings, humbles us as "the heavens declare the glory of God." --And how much more the gift of God's Son. "How Great is Our God!"
