## Faith, Freedom, and a Well-Timed Wake-Up Call

The transition from high school to college comes fully equipped with a good deal of freedom: freedom in the amount of Netflix shows you can watch in one sitting without your parents lecturing you about being lazy, freedom in the people you chose to surround yourself with, freedom in the food you eat, and freedom in the ability to turn off the alarm on Sunday morning. Once you move into the dorms you are no longer traveling to church as a family unit, you are flying solo, having to make the decision to get up and go on your own. From personal experience, how I choose to "center myself" and where I worship constantly shapes my faith-walk.

I think that it's common for kids who grow up in the church to perceive the actual act of going to church as routine. It's just simply what we do as a family on Sunday mornings, no arguments or doubts. Don't hear me say that this is a bad thing, but at some point the habit should produce a deeper value. Leaving the nest becomes a test of faith and priority to see what routine will begin to surface on Sunday mornings.

The professors at ACU stress the importance of plugging into a local church family as quickly as possible. While they are right, it is not an easy task for either local or out-oftown students. Is there a written rule for local graduates to keep membership at the church they have always attended? (\*Parental votes do not count...hahaha.) What if you have yet to step outside of your comfort zone to see for yourself what other churches are teaching or if there is a better fit? Where are my friends worshipping?

High school graduates (or anyone in a transitional period of life), it is time to start asking the tough questions. Is your faith your own, or an extension of your upbringing? Are you moved and/or challenged by scriptures, songs, communion, or sermons on a regular basis, or do you feel stuck in a spiritual rut? I am a firm believer of faith growing in moments of freedom. I have the freedom to make my own choices, so I need to be ready to justify my choices to anyone who comes asking.

Three years ago when I was a senior in high school, if you had asked me why I was a member at Hillcrest, I am about 90% certain I would have responded with, "Well it's where my family has always gone." While it is the truth, where I attend doesn't define my spirituality. How I turn my faith into actions better represents my relationship with God. Hillcrest has afforded me a place to grow my faith, be in community with a strong university population, and use my gifts within the Baby Bunch and Children's ministry. My faith is still growing and changing and evolving, just as I am, but my advice to graduates and future graduates (or anyone in a life transition) is to take a page from Samuel's memorable wake-up call and Eli's advice to be still, and if he calls you, say, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." (I Samuel 3:9) Faith is an action not a habit. Where will the Lord take you?
