The Righteous: Reproached and Rewarded

The Wisdom of Solomon was authored anonymously in perhaps the first century before the birth of Jesus. The unknown author describes the viewpoint of an unbeliever.

They did not reason rightly and said among themselves:

"Short and sorrowful is our life We came into being by chance, and hereafter we shall be as though we had never existed.... Come then, let us enjoy the good things while we can.... Let us take our fill of costly wines and perfumes."

The conduct toward others is similarly self-centered:

"Let us oppress the righteous poor man; let us show no mercy to the widow nor have any regard for the gray hairs of the aged. For us let might be right." This unbeliever reproaches the godly person: "Let us set a trap for the righteous person, because he is inconvenient to us, and he opposes our actions and rebukes us for sins against the law.... He professes to know God and calls himself a 'child of the Lord.' He is a reproof to us..., because his life is unlike that of others.... Let us test him with insult and torture that we may find out how gentle he is and make trial of his forbearance." (Wisdom of Solomon 2:1-19)

This sounds very contemporary with the pleasure-seeking and especially with the attitude toward those who try to live by God's law. We live in a time when the assumptions of society are not those of Bible believers. In particular, believers are considered out-of-date, strange, and at best inconvenient to the majority of persons.

The response of the author of *Wisdom of Solomon* is appropriate for Christians.

Thus they reasoned, but they were led astray, for their wickedness blinded them, and they did not know the secret purposes of God, nor hope for the wages of holiness.... For God created humans for incorruption and made them in the image of his own nature.... The souls of the righteous are in the hand of God.... But the ungodly will be punished as their reasoning deserves, those who disregarded the righteous and rebelled against the Lord. (Wisdom of Solomon 2:21-3:1, 10)

Let us not be intimidated by unbelievers or be discouraged by the cultural forces that oppose God's ways. Most of history has seen the same circumstances, and we must consider the end: immortality or eternal punishment.
