# Connecting to the Community and One Another

Last week's article recounted the experiences of David who sought a church family for himself and his family as he suffered from AIDS. David asked to be a part of the community but offered to leave quietly if the church leaders thought it best. The elders decided to welcome him into their community but still had to decide how best to incorporate David into the church family.

The next response from David and the church was an effort to understand the disease and the process involved in its transmission. A medical doctor was invited to speak to the entire assembly of the church a few days after David had been welcomed publicly and his condition explained to the same assembly. The church was encouraged to visit him and talk openly about their feelings and his. Through the effort to understand, a strong relationship was developing between David and the community of believers. Several people made it a personal goal to visit David daily. At first the visits were motivated by the mutual giving of an effectual relationship. In the end, everyone knew that David had given more than he received from this small church.

A strong and trusting relationship developed between the minister and his young dying friend. They shared the joy they had both come to experience by understanding Jesus as a lover of people, any kind of people. When David's family arrived to visit his new community of faith, they were accepted with open arms by the congregation.

Touching came to be important for the congregation. As the members began to understand that they were not in physical danger from the disease, handshakes and hugs were part of the expression of love given to David. Understandably some people still shied away. David understood. Some continued to express doubts. David understood.

As the love and acceptance for David grew within the congregation, the light of Christian love shined brightly to the community. Doctors and nurses began attending worship assemblies with David. Nurses, doctors and other medical staff joined in prayer in the hospital room with David and visiting church members.

A few days before David's death, the minister asked a question of his beloved friend, "What would you like me to tell other young men and women who find themselves hurting and alone like you were?" David paused...then replied, "TELL THEM, DON'T BE AFRAID TO COME HOME." David died a few nights later. Surrounding him were family, and representatives of his community of faith. The journey began with doubt and fear. Yet, through openness, a desire to understand, acceptance, trust, and the power of Holy Spirit, David's journey became filled with grace. He had found the safe place to die which he had lovingly sought. By yielding to the power and guidance of the Spirit, the family of God had connected with David, one another, and the community.
