Hillcrest and World Bible School

Besides the wonderful results being seen from on-going world-wide evangelism through World Bible School's postal and internet courses, new WBS ministries are opening doors for reaching even more lost people with the Gospel. Hillcrest is partnering with WBS in new ways as well.

God Bless East Africa (GBEA)

As part of WBS' global strategy, East Africa has been targeted for special attention regarding recruitment. The receptivity to receiving WBS courses is high in the 4 countries included in this region: Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda and S. Sudan. From 2014 to 2016, WBS is conducting a campaign in those countries called God Bless East Africa (GBEA). The focus on Kenya in 2014 and Uganda in 2015 had a great impact. Tanzania and S. Sudan will receive more attention in 2016 and beyond.

Hillcrest's missionary Phil Palmer is WBS' East Africa representative in charge of the GBEA campaign. He travels to the target countries twice a year (in January and for several weeks in the summer), along with his wife Elaine. He works with national church leaders, first to train and equip them to participate in GBEA as recruiters, then to hold outdoor preaching crusades and WBS enrollment across each country. The proclamation of the gospel and the mobilization of volunteer WBS recruiters result in many conversions. The campaign encourages the local congregations who incorporate those new converts. It gives evangelists a simple tool for ongoing outreach. It also creates networks through which American WBS teachers can send live servants of the church to meet their students, baptize them and continue teaching them.

World Sunday School: "Friends"

World Bible School produces three courses designed for children, called the "Friends" series. They are written at a simple grade-school level. In East Africa many churches have Sunday School programs, but poverty prevents most of them from getting materials. *World Sunday School* helps meet the need of the African churches while also giving children in American churches exposure and a chance to learn about foreign missions. **Hillcrest's fourth grade Bible class** is adopting the Sunday School program from the Baraka Road Church of Christ in Nairobi, Kenya and will send them the 'Friends' courses. They will gather change or in other ways collect the needed funds and send the books to their adopted Sunday School. The children from both churches will exchange names and photos and pray for each other.
