Does God Wear a Watch?

The topic of time interests me a lot. I am time-bound... I'm temporal... trapped within the clutches of time. Time is the paradigm through which I define the world around me; it colors the way in which I think and act. My life is divided into "then", "now", and "later." I find myself regretting the things I did "back then" and hoping to do better "later." This concept so permeates my thinking that I'm tempted to overlay my fears, anxieties, and points of view upon God, wondering if He sees me through the same lens. However, God doesn't wear a watch.

Unlike me, God is not a temporal being. Time is a construct of God's, therefore He has existence outside of the parameters of His construction of time. To God, time is like a map that He can observe objectively and all at once. Whereas I have regret about "the past" and anxiety about "the future", God does not, nor does He measure me in this manner as it relates to time as I perceive it. This aspect of God is important to comprehend in terms of how I understand His mercy and grace. I'm tempted to apply my time-bound understanding and approach to life upon God by thinking that He was angry with me "yesterday" when I sinned, but that he may be pleased with me tomorrow if I am "good." Subjective feelings of pleasure and acceptance, or anger and disdain are a function of being time-bound – which God is decidedly not. Therefore His grace and mercy can apply to me equally at all "times" (as I would perceive it) because God "is"; there is no "yesterday" or "tomorrow" for God where He would see me as more or less deserving of His love and mercy. I have been placed into a linear existence by God and, consequently, must act according to those parameters. He is not bound by those same parameters nor is He subject to the constructed paradigm of time.

This understanding of time and how it relates to us as created beings and to God as The Creator is pivotal in my understanding of how God sees me. In God's timeless view I am no more or less worthy of His love, forgiveness, and mercy when I am "being good" than when I am "being bad." This truth of the nature of God brings great comfort to me as His mercy is no longer driven by my actions, but rather His holiness. Inasmuch as I understand God's nature, I am more free to praise and honor Him for that nature – free from being driven by my own sin, neither fearing His reprisal nor (perhaps more importantly) believing myself worthy of His divine pleasure. God never perceives me as more or less worthy of His mercy and love because He sees me in totality, never in segmented points of time.

If God loves you and shows you mercy (as He most certainly does), take solace in the fact that He does so from a timeless standpoint, not from a temporal one. He loves you then, now, and forever exactly the same as He is the same "yesterday, today, and forever." So, never ask God "What time is it?" He will always say "yes."
