SCARS OF HOPE

But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed. Isaiah 53:5

I was born with a birth defect called Craniosynostosis. It is a fairly rare condition that affects the way an infant's head grows. The soft spot closes prematurely and can affect the shape of the head and some times the brain. I was still an infant when surgery was performed to reset the sutures in my skull. I have absolutely no memories of this. I have seen the pictures where I had Teflon tape covering the top of my head while the bones healed. What I do keep memory of is the 7 to 8 inch scar that runs from the back of my head to the front. My hair covers it up for the most part. Being over 6 feet tall, not many people see the top of my head. In fact, other than my family, only those who cut my hair know that it is there. When they see it and discover how large it is they are curious to say the least. "What happened?" they wonder aloud. I wish I had a more exciting story or even a vague memory of the event itself. Instead, what I always carry with me is the scar, from a wound that happened near the very beginning of my life.

Some scars are not so easy to hide as the one on my head. For instance, the scars on the wrist of my friend who during a very low point once tried to take his own life. Then, there are wounds that cannot be seen with human eyes because they are of an emotional or psychological nature. Though invisible, they are very real and run very deep. Whatever the type, none of us makes it through life without these wounds. They become a part of us. They shape our experience and in turn, how we view life. Our scars, imperfections, and defects are what make us human.

God transforms our brokenness. The resurrected Christ still bore the marks of the cross. John records the dramatic way in which Jesus calls Thomas to touch his wounds (John 20:27). The wounds remained, but they were transformed into something glorious. They were once the sign of Jesus certain demise; now God used the pierced body of Jesus to reveal his power over death. God's redemption to all who believe does the same today. God does not remove the scars, but he transforms them into a testimony of life over death. God works in the midst of our weakness, not in spite of it. Sharing this grace gives life and hope to our wounded world.
