You Are What You Fat

Well, the holidays are over and thus begins the dreaded first of the year diet. Don't sit there like you don't know what I'm talking about. We all over-indulged beginning with Halloween and it didn't stop until after January 1st. It was pretty good though, wasn't it? Grandma can really cook! There's much to be said for family gatherings and feasting. They become a part of us – our heritage and our traditions. It's more than mere nutrition, the food we eat becomes us in part because of where we get it and the context in which it was enjoyed. Gerhard Tersteegen, the early 18th century German Christian mystic, may have been thinking of this concept when he penned his poem:

> Man, earthy of the earth, an-hungered feeds On earth's dark poison tree -Wild gourds, and deadly roots, and bitter weeds; And as his food is he. And hungry souls there are, that find and eat God's manna day by day -And glad they are, there life is fresh and sweet, For as their food are they.

The evidence is all around us. People gorge themselves on a poisonous feast as they pull their chairs up to the table of the world and bite each other, embittering themselves on the food they think they're enjoying. Bitter, poisonous and wild they become, just like their food. I'm not talking about "sinners" who eschew the church and her God. I'm talking about us – the church. Paradoxically, we talk with great disdain about "those people" who are caught in sin. We gorge ourselves on the poisonous porridge of pride – it tastes soooo good – as we sniff at our fellow sinners on the news. Our will is fed by the wildness of "we" to the exclusion of others different from ourselves. We become boldly bitter toward the "bad" person next to us as we think we're better than they. It's all because of that "feast" offered by the world, cooked up and served by Satan himself. It looks good alright, but the effects are painful. Painful to God as He watches us fight each other and feed our ravenous selves, gaunt and never satisfied. Bloated on the junk of the world, we are sluggish and slothful to God.

In contrast, there is another meal. Not quite so garish and opulent, but oh so good for us. God's manna is served at His table of sacrifice. We can recognize the ones who feast at this table. They aren't busy grasping and greedily stuffing themselves full of selfadmiration, pride, and the praise of men. There is enough for all at God's table. When we scoot our chairs up to His table of manna we are fed with His goodness. We become what we eat as we consume the Bread of Life. Instead of selfishly sapping the life of others, we become a well-spring of fresh, sweet hope for the hungry, selflessly serving each other. All who hunger and thirst for righteousness will be filled.
