The Gospel According to Pluto

Pluto has been in the news a lot during the past two weeks. With the culmination of NASA's New Horizons mission, the "planet" has been the focus of a nine-and-a-half year voyage; and while this kind of exploratory mission is not new to NASA, the distances and sizes involved are unique. Setting aside the debate of whether or not Pluto is a planet – most of us grew up memorizing nine planets in the Solar System and are pretty happy keeping it in that list – I think there are two aspects of this story that resonate with our walk as faithful Christians.

First is the scale of the mission: Pluto is 4.67 billion miles from earth. Such a distance is unimaginable. If the sun was the size of a Sam's Club in downtown Manhattan, the Earth would be a grand piano in Trenton, New Jersey; Pluto would be a violin in Los Angeles. It took almost nine years for the satellite to travel from here to there, and the culmination of its mission was about 2½ hours (150 minutes) of a close approach. Those few minutes represent 3/1000 of a percent of the whole mission; or said another way – 99.997% of the time, the satellite was traveling and the scientists were waiting, preparing to do their important work. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus explains how the Father lavishes his love and good gifts on his children. It is easy to suggest that all the work put into a mission culminating in such a small window of data gathering is unnecessarily lavish, or costly, or even wasteful; yet the information received and the insights revealed have been truly extraordinary. How much more, then, does the Father lavish his blessings on us? And are we appropriately grateful?

In Luke 15, Jesus poses a question: "Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it?" This is a story about repentance, and the rejoicing in heaven that results in return. Pluto was a kind of lost sheep. True, we know about where it is in its 248-year orbit; but close enough would not work for *New Horizons*. What did work were the efforts of astronomer Carl Lampland. Almost every night for 20 years between 1930 and 1951, Lampland photographed the sky around Pluto. Those images were used to pinpoint Pluto in its orbit and predict exactly where it would be on July 14, 2015, at 5:49 am. What struck me as amazing about this observation was the effort of an individual to work on a project without even knowing if that work would be useful. Without Lampland's work, *New Horizons* would have likely missed Pluto. Are we consistent enough and patient enough for our efforts to yield such fruit? And can we fully realize the future harvest of our present kindness?

Let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us.
