Carrying Each Other's Burdens "The Body of Christ" Senior Graduate Series Part 1

I had never truly felt that I was a part of the body of Christ until I joined the Hillcrest Youth Group. During my freshman year of high school, I began following my older brother, Reilly, to Hillcrest; from then on I was hooked. There is something very different about this youth group that sets us apart from the rest. We share a bond together formed by the hand of Christ, and I had never felt that bond more strongly than when on Trek hiking

On my first Trek in Colorado, a storm had previously passed over our mountain causing fallen trees to cover the return trail down the mountain. Our three-hour hike back turned into a daylong hike over trees and debris. The wreckage was so bad that our trail guide lost the trail completely. All around us trees were piled so high we could walk under them. Yet through this experience, tired and worn out, our youth group gained the priceless gift of teamwork. We began stationing ourselves on what we guessed was the way back down, taking turns helping each other over tree after tree. Some places were so bad that we had to take off our packs and hand them to each other over the wreckage. Nothing brings a youth group closer together than literally carrying each other's backpacks down a mountain.

On my second Trek, this time at Big Bend Natl. Park, the youth group underwent a tradition we call "carry another's burden." We set our packs down in a circle and walked around the circle until Evan said stop, then whichever pack we were closest to was the pack we had to carry until we reached camp. I, being one of the smallest hikers in our group, was bestowed the great honor of carrying Evan Simmons' pack. For those of you who may not know, Evan hikes mountains and runs marathons for fun, so naturally he had the heaviest pack containing all our water for that day. Although I hiked with his pack for probably no more than 45 minutes, it felt like an eternity. I had to have help sitting down and getting back up again during our break. Others helped to steady me as we walked. The pack probably weighed as much as I did at the time and I had to carry it to our campsite. Later, with Evan's pack as far away from me as possible, I felt that it had been an honor to bear Evan's heavy burden, even for a short while. I had been the one to carry everyone's water for the last 45 minutes, and once I regained feeling in my shoulders, I actually thanked Evan for such a powerful lesson.

You may have had a similar experience in life, or you may feel tired just after reading about hiking, but my message remains the same. Sometimes, the best time to feel a part of the Body of Christ is not during the worship service or Sunday morning Bible class. Sometimes, you may feel the strongest bond while pulling your fellow "hikers" over fallen trees or feeling steady hands on your back as you stumble over rocks with a 90lb pack on your back. It is in these circumstances that we must learn to rely on others in Christ, and find that not only do you need the Body of Christ, but that the Body of Christ needs you.
