A New Place to Live

"The Body of Christ Senior Graduate Series" Part 2

6' 1", 180 lbs, salutatorian, and accepting a scholarship to play soccer at Lubbock Christian University. This is what I expected the end of my senior year would look like when I was a freshman in East Texas; but God really does have a sense of humor and an incredibly wicked curveball.

As the son of a youth minister, I could give the answer to just about any question about the Bible (from the perspective of an elementary student) by the time I was in second grade. My teachers loved it and I did too, but as my knowledge grew so did my spiritual ego. In high school my definition of "church" was simply the place you go every Sunday night and Wednesday night to meet with friends, catch up, make plans for any group activities, and make people feel special by talking to them. That was my freshman year, and I thought I had it all worked out. I had become desensitized to what I had in the church, but God was about to brush me back off the plate with his infamous curveball.

Summer began and it was going great, until about two or three weeks in. My sister and I were preparing to go to San Angelo where I would spend a week doing random household jobs for my grandparents who lived there. The day before we left my parents explained possible future plans to my sister and me. My mom had an interview with a school in Abilene for a possible teaching position which, if accepted, would mean that we had to move. She got the job and we were set to move to Abilene. That summer I attended ACU's Kadesh Bible camp and it was then that I realized that Abilene was my new home. The move to Abilene meant good scholarship opportunities at ACU, but that didn't make the move any easier. I had to get used to living in a new city.

I made the football team at my new school and after the first two weeks I had already gained a family who would do so much for me. But I still didn't know what to do about church. Many of my teammates attended Hillcrest so I went with them where I found a warm welcome in my youth huddle. My huddle leaders immediately welcomed me and became like my second and third set of parents. It was then that I realized the reason for God's moving me here.

I had lost sight of all that a church can do for someone because I became too comfortable. We aren't called to a life of praise and worship where we only have to stand for certain songs. We are called to put ourselves in situations where we need others to lean on and strengthen our faith. If you go out into the darkness with a single light, it's natural to look for other lights. If there are none then you do all you can to create new lights. I had been in a situation where I had lights all around me that made me feel too comfortable. But I was put into a new place where I had to search for these new lights – the people around me here at Hillcrest. All I had to do was trust God to direct me and step out towards those lights.
