I Will Sing Praises to the Lord

Several of the songs we sing in the service today have been written by a single hymn writer: Franny Crosby [1820-1915] was one of the most prolific writers of hymns in history, having written the words to more than 8,000 hymns and gospel songs. She was blind from shortly after birth and would compose hymns entirely in her mind finally dictating them to someone for transcription. Often she would compose six or seven hymns in one day. Her hymns were loved and sung a century ago and continue to be sung in churches today.

Among Crosby's songs in our hymn book are "Safe In the Arms of Jesus," "Take the World But Give Me Jesus," "Blessed Assurance," "I Am Thine, O Lord," "Jesus Is Tenderly Calling Thee Home," "Praise Him, Praise Him," "Rescue the Perishing," "Though Your Sins Be As Scarlet," "Jesus, Keep Me Near the Cross," "Hide Me, O My Savior," "'Tis the Blessed Hour of Prayer," "Savior, More Than Life to Me," "Tell Me the Story of Jesus," "A Wonderful Savior," "Thou, My Everlasting Portion," and "To God Be the Glory"

At Hillcrest, we sing a large variety of hymns. We sing "gospel hymns" like those by Crosby; we sing even older hymns, sometimes called "majestic hymns of the church;" we sing newer and contemporary songs. Hillcrest is a singing church. Our aim is for the entire congregation to sing "psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord in your hearts." [Eph. 5:19, NRSV]

This means we must know the songs we sing, and we must sing the songs that are a part of the lives of all groups in our congregation. Let us appreciate what a responsibility and demand for good judgment lies on our song leaders. While Odies Wright is our regular song leader-and is the one who from time to time teaches us new songs-we are happy to have others who lead when he is gone.

Hillcrest offers several opportunities to sing and learn hymns in addition to singing at our services. The Hillcrest Singers, now under the direction of Greg Straughn, has been a part of this congregation for 30 years. They rehearse on Wednesday nights and present programs perhaps 20 times a year. Then each January, Odies Wright leads a two-day singing retreat to learn new songs and enjoy ones we already know. Many of our members enjoy singing at home with their families or listening to CDs as they drive.

How much we have to be grateful for! In our prayers, let us not forget to give thanks for hymn writers, for those who translate the Bible into all the languages of the world (sometimes at the cost of their own lives), for those who write the books which spur us on to greater faith, as well as for those ministers, teachers and song leaders who serve us in our own congregation.
