Instant Replay

I have instant replay. Not the one you're likely thinking of. I'm not talking about the instant replay on TV where referees are second-guessed. I'm talking about the one in my mind. In "real time" I'm not too impressive, but in my instant replay I'm witty and incising. Perhaps you know what I'm talking about. The instant replay of the mind is where you replay what you would have liked to have said or done in order to make yourself look more impressive, rather than that sheepish reply you actually made.

I find myself wasting a tremendous amount of time thinking about a given situation and how I might have responded to make me look strong and brilliant (in my own mind at least). That person at work says something to my disliking and I respond with an anemic "no"; later I replay the scene in my mind over and over, refining my response each time until I say just the right thing to put him in his place. Of course, in my instant replay my would-be adversary tucks tail and bows to my obvious superiority. He is instantly awestruck by my brilliant come-back and realizes the error of his ways. I then walk away with a self-assured swagger, knowing that the world has just been meliorated by my wit. Bystanders look on with admiration, envious of my astute comeback delivered with such astute acuity. "Yes... that's what I should have said" I think to myself. I may then sigh in contented pleasure knowing that I am in the right.

How ridiculous I must seem to God.

Even if I were to say what I wanted, in most cases it would have done more damage than good. Certainly, nobody would be impressed with my comeback. I'm embarrassed at how many times per day I engage in this worthless exercise. Now conscious of the practice, I am amazed at how many times I "instant replay" an engagement in my mind. The problem with this practice, other than the abject waste of time, is that it is completely self-serving. There is no justice, only selfishness. My thoughts are directed solely toward my own glorification, gratifying my own ego instead of glorifying God.

"Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory." Colossians 3:2-4

My disposition toward instant replay in my mind would seem to indicate that I have yet a fair bit to go in assimilating this passage into my spiritual being. When I replay these scenes in my mind, it's clear that my life is not "hidden with Christ in God," but alive and well in my own mind — on earthly things like my own self-aggrandizement. I'm too impatient to await Christ in his glory, so I'll create my own glory in my own mind... to my shame.

It's time to end the instant replay rule. It's time to set my mind on "things above," not myself.
