For Just Such a Time as This

Like many people at Hillcrest, I am deeply conflicted over Matt and Leslie Haynes' departure. He is an outstanding preacher, gifted teacher of the word, and dear friend. I marvel at his ability to bring fresh insights from texts that I thought I knew well, as he helps me to see the revelation of God in a new way and challenges me to act consistently with the ministry of Christ. We have all had preachers and teachers who left an unusually powerful impact on our lives of faith, and Matt is one such person for me. Leslie is his ideal ministry partner: a woman of strength, wisdom and integrity who helps create a loving foundation for their joint role in the kingdom. The conflict I feel with their move is similar to what one feels when any dear friend moves: you will miss the friend and their direct influence on your life, yet you also want the best for them, and you are hopeful and excited about the new opportunities in their path.

The departure of a beloved minister after a short ministry stay also forces me into a series of reflections. Why was Matt and Leslie's time here at Hillcrest so short? What was the purpose of a two-year stint in the pulpit? Our human minds seek explanations and answers, yet God often softly encourages us to walk in the mystery of faith. I am reminded of the conversation Esther had with her uncle Mordecai during a time of grave persecution of the Jews. She had been taken into the royal household of the king of Persia, and Mordecai encouraged her to use her position and influence with the king to bring deliverance to her people. Perhaps the most famous line in the book of Esther arises from Mordecai's sage advice: "For if you keep silence at such a time as this, relief and deliverance will rise for the Jews from another quarter, but you and your father's family will perish. Who knows? Perhaps you have come to royal dignity for just such a time as this." (Esther 4:14, NRSV). Consider Mordecai's wisdom: God's purpose for his people will be accomplished, whether through Esther or someone else. But perhaps—just perhaps—her whole reason for being in a particular place at a particular time and embedded in a particular series of relationships was to be an instrument of God's specific will for a discrete subset of his people.

Does this same principle hold true in the present case with Matt and Leslie? One must be careful in taking words written 2500 years ago and presuming they mean the same thing in a radically different context in the present. But Mordecai's suggestion, couched as it was in mystery and humility, may point a way forward as my mind seeks an explanation. Were Matt and Leslie at Hillcrest for just such a time as this? "Who knows? Perhaps...."
