Bologna, No Fish, and the Way of Godly Manhood

This week I learned that a great man had passed away. As a young, newly-married man, I had two mentors. One mentored me spiritually, showing by word and action, what it meant to be a faithful man of God. That man went home to his God a few years back. My other mentor showed me what it was to be a godly husband and father. He showed me the strength found in being dependable and honest. In a world wrought with confusion about what it means to be a "real man", this man showed me what it means to be a godly man. He displayed leadership (he was an elder in the church) without pretense and knew God as the sole source of wisdom.

This was a man who understood that people were more important than issues and that every issue that came to him in the form of a decision to be made had the very real lives of people involved. He was a courageous man who wasn't afraid to love. He loved his wife, his family, the church, and Jesus. He loved nature, seeing it as a reflection of a God who loves the world. What set this man apart from so many others is that the love he had was manifested in his actions. To him, "loving" meant "doing". It meant that he spent his time on the people and things he loved. He saw love everywhere. I remember sitting in a fishing boat with him one weekend when we decided to break out the sandwiches for lunch. I remarked at how much better a simple bologna sandwich tasted "out here". He replied that the reason it tasted better was because it was made in love, meaning our wives. That was the kind of man he was. He saw great love in a bologna sandwich.

Another time, again out in nature, I was not having success in catching fish. Rather than being angry at my lack of skill or the fish, he simply adjusted. "Let's try a different bait and a different place; then we'll be patient." It didn't work. We didn't catch anything at all. I was disappointed, however this man of God reminded me that a day spent in nature was a day spent witnessing the wisdom of God. Patience meant understanding that some things were simply out of our control and that faith in God involved receiving the disappointing times with the same cheer as the "successful" times. That's the kind of man I want to be – a man of God... a man who understood and applied faith to every facet of his life. I've read many books that have attempted to define faith in various ways, but the few words and actions of this man of God expressed a wisdom few achieve in this world.

I pray that you have a mentor in your life, they're important. My great mentors are gone home now, but the lessons they taught me echo in the chambers of my heart. This is, I believe, one of the reasons we have a church. The older teach the younger. If you don't have an older man or woman in your life, you're missing out on one of the great blessings of God – the blessing of the body of Christ. Thank you, Robert Taylor, for mentoring me. I'll see you again.
