These Kids Today!

I'll bet you've heard that in the past, perhaps recently. Maybe you have even said it yourself. I have made a few observations regarding this generation of kids – your kids. You see, I get to spend a fair amount of time with them. I see them in class on Wednesday nights and I occasionally teach them on Sunday mornings. More specifically, I spend all day with "these kids today" teaching my 12th grade English class. On this Senior Sunday, allow me to express a few of my observations.

These kids today are unusually generous. You may suggest that their generosity is the result of having so much, but that would be counter to what most people, including myself, actually observe in real life. There is a reason why Jesus suggested how hard it is for a rich person to enter the kingdom of heaven... harder than a camel going through the eye of a needle. To be fair, this generation has been given a lot; however, they are quick to share everything too. They share their time, money, food, etc. This generation is one of the most altruistic in a long time. I see them give without any expectation.

If you want to motivate this generation to do something, give them a cause outside of themselves. Far from being the "me" generation, your kids love to get behind a cause that transcends their own being. This trait might be observed in any group their age, but it seems unusually strong in this generation. They want to believe in something.

Your kids love to question things. Again, perhaps a trait of youth; however, I have observed that they don't merely "question authority" or question the status quo, but rather they seem to truly be seeking. I believe this because when you give them answers they think about them... a lot. They respond to truth and reasonable answers.

I really don't intend to put a damper on the joy of today, but I believe there is great difficulty for God's church in the future. But I also believe that God is raising up a generation of men and women who will be fearless in their love and faith. I have the great privilege of spending a lot of time with your kids and I want to say that I'm impressed. They're not perfect by any means; they have a lot to learn yet. But I really believe, based upon evidence and reason, that God is going to do truly great things with this generation.

These kids today... a generation chosen by grace.

God did not reject his people, whom he foreknew. Don't you know what Scripture says in the passage about Elijah—how he appealed to God against Israel: "Lord, they have killed your prophets and torn down your altars; I am the only one left, and they are trying to kill me?" And what was God's answer to him? "I have reserved for myself seven thousand who have not bowed the knee to Baal." So too, at the present time there is a remnant chosen by grace!
