Sonic Struggles

Summer is upon us and you know what that means: more trips to Sonic for drinks. I have to admit that I experience a fair amount of stress when I frequent these local establishments. My anxiety is not rooted in the food, or the price, or anything of the sort. It's in the ordering. I have to admit it... I suffer from drive-thru ordering anxiety.

Every time I approach one of those boards with the speaker it begins; I start to stress about what I'm going to say. "Will I forget my order? Will I stutter? Will I order it incorrectly?" It's terrible! I know I must sound like an utter fool when I order from those things. I'm fairly confident that the poor attendant, whose fate it is to suffer through my ineptitude in placing my order, is rolling their eyes. I even suspect that I may be recognized. "Guess who is back? It's that guy who can't order right" they must surely whisper to one of their colleagues near them. Yes, I must certainly be the object of scorn and derision for order-takers all over Abilene. I try to simply order by the number, "I'll take the number one." But inevitably, the questions come: "Would you like cheese?" "Would you like to up-size that?" "What would you like to drink?" I normally begin my reply with a less-than-eloquent, "Ummmm... I, uh...". My family strains to stifle laughter as I, a person who is paid to speak in front of crowds in a professional capacity on a daily basis, stumble through my order in a most incoherent manner. It's pathetic.

Having expended a fair amount of thought as to the source of my anxiety, I have come to the conclusion that as long as I can see the person with whom I am speaking, I'm ok. If, however, I cannot see them I tend to make a fool of myself and often don't know what to say. I could extend this quandary to prayer.

I wonder sometimes if one possible source of my difficulties in praying may be found in the fact that I can't visually see God. I have observed that my prayers sometimes feel forced or awkward, like I'm talking to myself rather than to God. I must sound like a stammering fool to God as I run through my list of wants as opposed to a genuine pouring out of my soul or offering of praise. If my prayers seem stale at times, and they do, then perhaps the problem is me. I'm too focused on "seeing" God the way I want to rather than trusting in His providence within my darkness. When I spend too much time worrying about me, I have trouble focusing upon the One who deserves my worship. I guess my prayers would be healthier if I could stop trying to see so much (like an audience) and trust His wisdom – that there really is someone on the other side. I need to stop trying to place my order with God and just trust in His will. It's time to stop treating God like a drive-thru ordering experience.
