The Torn Curtain

The curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. (Mark 15:38)

That's all it says. No explanation. No commentary. Just a simple statement...yet packed with meaning. It's one of those points of connection that links the story that began centuries before to the present. Maybe the writer (Mark) didn't think any commentary was necessary; however, I think it more likely that Mark had no idea how significant that torn curtain was. It just seemed to be worth mentioning.

Behind the curtain was the Most Holy Place, the home of the Ark of the Covenant with its mercy seat. Only the high priest could enter and he only once a year... with blood... on the Day of Atonement to offer sacrifice for the sins of the people. Except for that one man on that one day, no one else ever entered the Most Holy Place, and no one was to be nearby when the high priest went in.

The book of Hebrews (chapter 9) tells us that the temple was actually just a replica of the true temple in heaven. When Jesus, the Son of God, came to be our high priest, he did not enter a temple made with hands. He entered heaven itself and went before the very throne of his father to offer his own blood on our behalf. That's when the curtain tore. Jesus breathed his last (Mark 15:37) and then the curtain tore.

The curtain stood between man and God... at least until it tore. Hebrews 10:19-22 says that now "we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, his body, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings...."

I envision Jesus going through the curtain... the torn curtain... and just before he disappears, he turns back toward us and, motioning with his hand, says, "Come on... let's go see our Father."

The curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. It's the subtlety of the event that I find so profound. An artifact from the ritualistic system instituted by Moses centuries before is torn at the very moment marking the central turning point of history and it's not until years later that the event is understood... one of those sub-plots in a broader narrative that point to a divine author.

Just as the cross is a symbol of hope and salvation for believers in Christ, reminding us of the sacrificial death of our Lord and Savior, there is a torn curtain hanging in heaven through which we follow him to the throne of God. "Come on... let's go see our Father."
