Julian's "Gimmee" List

I know what you're thinking. You're sitting there reading a text in English wondering who the first woman was to write in English. Well, I have good news for you; I have the answer: Julian of Norwich, born in 1342. She wrote *The Revelations of Divine Love...* in English. Why is this obscure fact so important? Other than appealing to my fellow English nerds, Julian (likely not her real name) was a Christian and wanted her writing to be accessible to the common man who's Latin was probably not too great.

Julian was pretty well renowned for her great advice. Admittedly, she had a pretty good amount of time to think since: 1. She had no T.V. (14th century after all), and 2. She was an "anchorite," meaning she was "anchored" to the world for the purpose of serving others. Julian enclosed herself in a cell attached to a church and through a small window in the exterior wall she dispensed her wisdom to passers-by who cared to inquire. Weird arrangement by our modern standards; however, it was pretty effective since neither Twitter nor Facebook had been invented yet.

Having survived the Black Plague, Julian famously prayed for three "wounds." First, she prayed that God would "wound" her with a humble and contrite heart, making her aware of her own shortcomings. Second, she prayed that God would "wound" her with an enduring compassion for the world. Third, Julian prayed that God would "wound" her with an unshakeable passion and love for God. Hmmm. Well, that's a pretty interesting prayer journal entry. I guess it beats the usual "gimmee" approach that we often use with our prayer lives. You know what I mean; "gimmee" healing, "gimmee" peace in life, "gimmee" a better life, etc. As I read the writings of Julian of Norwich I'm a bit convicted regarding my list of "gimmee's" compared to hers. Rather than separating herself from the world, insulating herself from sundry "untouchables" in society, she "anchored" herself in the world, making herself available to all who would pass by. I have a tendency to "anchor" myself in cushy places more amicable to my wants and desires, which normally means "away from people who want something from me."

To be honest, I have neither the slightest intention, nor inclination to live in a cell next to Hillcrest; however, I may in fact consider the spirit which drove Julian of Norwich to her unusual living arrangements: namely, a genuine desire to serve others. Furthermore, praying for humility with regard to self, compassion for others, and love of God is not a bad idea.

While most of Europe was being infected with the Black Plague, Julian of Norwich lived a life of infectious Christian joy in the midst of overwhelming suffering all about her. Her secret was, of course, her faith in God. This faith led her to her servant-like disposition and her selfless prayer life. It also led her to the other phrase famously attributed to her, shockingly – boldly – declaring during one of the darkest periods of England's history that because of God, "all shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of thing shall be well."

May God anchor you among people who need His love and to hear that "all shall be well." James McGee
