Killed With Kindness

Perhaps we rarely consider kindness to be dangerous to our souls. Rightly so; after all, we're taught to be kind from an early age. However, the problem with my kindness is that I have a tendency to define it in exclusionary terms. You know what I mean; I define my kindness by what I don't do. I don't lie (much), I don't cheat or steal, I don't do or say harmful things to people (for the most part). I'm a "kind" person according to, and defined by, the latest social trend. Thus, I am a good person because I feel kind and benevolent. But as C.S. Lewis says, "Everyone feels benevolent if nothing happens to be annoying him at the moment." Yep, there it is... in the immortal words of Hamlet, "Ay, there's the rub."

Life has a way of annoying me and this annoyance usually involves other people. So here's how it works: I feel benevolent - good - until someone, usually some thoughtless, callous person who is not as "good" as me, bumbles along and does something contrary to my liking. I think that now I must be justified in lashing out at that person because I have already established my own "goodness" earlier.

The real problem isn't the other person's evil nature, but rather my own. Our culture is suffering from a lack of acknowledgement of our own sinfulness. I am not a "basically good person upon whom God must surely smile." I am a sinful person, deserving of God's wrath and for whom Jesus died to pay for my sins which were an affront to a Holy God. Once I recognize my own sinfulness, I can truly understand and appreciate that which Jesus has done for me. He didn't sacrifice himself for a good person, but for a sinful one.

You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Romans 5:6-8

When I fail to understand my own sinfulness, I wonder about the goodness of God who allows things not to my liking to happen to me; after all, I'm a "good, kind person", so why does He allow pain into my life? These are the illogical whisperings of Satan who would pacify me with fables of my own goodness and worthiness, only to cast doubt upon the goodness of God.

When I come to an understanding of my own sinfulness, I will truly appreciate the goodness of God, the holiness of God, the justice of God, and the mercy of God.
