Blessed at Hillcrest: Haiti Medical Mission with LiveBeyond

I have been on eight Medical Mission trips with your help through "Send the Light". Four were with the Zambia Medical Mission and I have now been to Haiti four times with LiveBeyond. Medical missions are a way that I believe God can use me to minister to those in need using my nursing degree.

Haitian women have a difficult life with many pregnancies, some resulting in births and some in miscarriage. They deliver their babies on dirt floors and cut the umbilical cord with rocks. The babies are often underweight and some die during birth along with their mothers. The living conditions are very poor with most living in huts made from branches, with dirt floors, and (hopefully) a tin roof. Others may live in a tiny concrete building – these are the nice homes. These women have very little help caring for their babies and other children, and little to feed them. But with the LiveBeyond Maternal Health Clinic, now these women are being fed, receiving food for their children, prenatal vitamins, obstetric care, and the perinatal mortality rate has decreased by more than 66 percent.

I have worked in Maternal Health a couple of days on each of my trips. Here I have an opportunity to talk one on one with each of these women while I am taking their blood pressure and recording their weight. As you can probably guess, most of these mothers do not have basics such as clean water, a blanket, or even a clean cloth to wipe their baby's bottom readily available to them. As I visit with them, I try to find out their needs and what we can do to help them obtain these basic items to care for their newborn. I also try my best to look each mother in the eye and tell them that God loves them and their babies.

One morning, I looked down and saw what I thought was a doll in one mother's lap... but then she moved. I was shocked that this was a baby, the tiniest one that I had ever laid eyes on. Edna was her name and she was born two months early. Her 19-year-old mother died while giving birth, so Edna's aunt had taken her in and was keeping her alive by feeding her goat's milk. This was the first time Edna had been brought to the clinic; she was 22-days-old and weighed 2 lbs. 13.5 oz. We took the aunt and baby Edna to Dr. Vanderpool who remembered that one of the nurses, Erin VanZandt, was a NICU nurse (God's providence). The aunt continued to bring Edna to the clinic every day and Erin showed her how to care for this tiny one, while we were taking turns caring for and feeding her.

There are other areas of the medical mission and I love ministering in each one. However, this year the Maternal Health Clinic, baby Edna and God's providence ministered to my heart as well.
