The Lord's Table

"You cannot drink the cup of the Lord and the cup of demons. You cannot partake of the table of the Lord and the table of demons" (1 Corinthians 10:21, NRSV).

The phrase 'table of the Lord' perhaps comes from Malachi 1:10-12. The "Lord's table" in Malachi is associated with the altar at the temple in Jerusalem. The practice among Jews, as among Greeks and Romans, was for an animal, grain, or liquid to be sacrificed to the deity on an altar. Except in cases of a whole burnt offering, part of the animal or other food and drink that was sacrificed went to the officiating priests, and part was eaten by the worshipers at a table. Hence, Paul said in 1 Corinthians 10:18, "Consider the people of Israel; are not those who eat the sacrifices partners in the altar?"

Although related in practice, an altar and a table were distinct in significance. The altar was the place of sacrifice, and the table was the place for the sharing of a meal, a communion or fellowship. To eat what had been sacrificed, however, was to eat from the altar. This practice was the background to Paul's words. To eat what had been sacrificed to a pagan deity was to partake at the table of demons.

The Christian parallel to pagan and Jewish practice is that the death of Christ was a sacrifice, and the Lord's Supper is to partake of this sacrifice, the body and blood of Christ in the form of bread and wine.

Our communion table is not an altar, although some churches regard it as such. If it is regarded as a place of sacrifice, it is a sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to God for his sacrifice of Christ. The Lord's Table rather has the association of a shared meal, a communion, a fellowship.

Some in the church at Corinth wanted to have one foot in the church and the other foot in their pagan environment--to share in the church's activities and to share in the meals that were an important part of the social, economic, and religious life of the pagan world. In contrast, Paul insists that sharing in communion with Christ establishes an exclusive loyalty.

We may be tempted to make compromises with our society--perhaps not to open idolatry but with practices and activities that are inconsistent with the Christian profession. Our partaking of the Lord's Supper should remind us that we cannot have fellowship both with the Lord and with the world.
