"YETI" Churches

I recently received one of those "Yeti" cups that keep either cold drinks cold or hot drinks hot all day as the case may be. I really like it a lot. I'm a tea-sipper; I drink iced tea all day long. With my Yeti cup I can fill it full of ice, pour my tea in and it stays cold until it's gone. If you don't have one, you need one! Rather than a breakthrough in technology of cup-making, I think it's really a pretty simple design: a metal sleeve inside a metal sleeve with a vacuum in between the layers. Brilliant. The result is that cold or hot drinks remain so for an extraordinary amount of time. The whole point is to shield the vulnerable inside from the harsh effects of the outside. In other words, protect the temperature of my tea (cold) from the effects of the warm air outside. It works.

I think that God intends the church to act in this manner. I remember once while I was stationed in South Korea that we had a fellow in our fellowship who had recently become a Christian. He was so very excited to be a follower of Jesus — one may say that he was "on fire" for Christ. His faith temperature was "hot." Unfortunately, there was a person on base who tried to convince this young man that he wasn't really a Christian because he didn't have the ability to speak in tongues. This greatly troubled the young man and it began to douse his fervor for Jesus... he began to have serious doubts and his faith was in danger of cooling. I had the opportunity to speak with him and we looked at several passages in the Bible where the teaching was clear on the point — there was absolutely no need to speak in tongues and his salvation was secure. In other words, I had the opportunity to act as an insulator from an outside attempt to "cool" his fervor for Jesus. Later, I had a discussion with the person who had attempted to shake this young man's faith and suggested that if he truly wanted to study the point that I was more than willing, but that he should leave the young Christians alone. I got to be a Yeti Christian!

Just like my Yeti cup that shields the vulnerable inside from the harsh outside, God placed me in the position to shield a young Christian from an attempt to harm his faith. Clearly, this isn't about me. I think God expects us all to care for each other in this way. This is how the Church is supposed to work. The older should protect the younger. Our faith is constantly under attack from the world. Each generation should be able to depend upon those who have been there before us to help guide us in Truth. We greatly need people with a few grey hairs! In many ways, they are the outside layer that can take the most. You may have the opportunity to shield me from that which would do me harm or I someone else. We protect each other. We are a YETI Church.
