"Three Questions"

My summer reading included some of the short stories by the Russian novelist and moralist Leo Tolstoi. In one of these, a king thought that he would never fail in his undertakings "if he knew the right time to begin everything; if he knew who were the right people to listen to, and whom to avoid; and, above all, if he knew what was the most important thing to do." He consulted many learned men, who gave him contradictory answers. Hence, disguised as a peasant, the king went to see a hermit, known for his wisdom. The hermit was digging in the ground, and the king asked him: "How can I learn to do the right thing at the right time? Who are the people I most need? . . . And, what affairs are the most important?"

Since the hermit was tired, the king took the spade and began digging in the garden for him, but the hermit gave him no answer to his questions. Then someone came running, bleeding from the stomach. The king washed the wound, bandaged it, gave the man a drink of water, and laid him down to rest. The next morning the injured man identified himself as an enemy who wanted to kill the king, whom he had recognized. He had been wounded by the king's bodyguard and then escaped. He asked forgiveness because of the kindness shown him by the king.

The king asked the hermit again for an answer to his three questions, to which the hermit replied, "You have already been answered!" He explained, if you had not been digging the beds for me and returned home, the enemy would have killed you. "I was the most important man; and to do me good was your most important business." Furthermore, when the wounded man arrived, without your assistance he would have died without making peace with you, "so he was the most important man, and what you did for him was your most important business."

There is only one time that is important--now! It is the most important time because it is the only time when we have any power. The most necessary man is he with whom you are, for no man knows whether he will ever have dealings with anyone else; and the most important affair is to do him good, because for that purpose alone was man sent into this life!
