People Are Like Airplanes

Once, during my time in the Air Force, I was given the job of reassembling a rather complex component on an aircraft. I found a box of parts waiting for me and a manual of how it should look when finished. The job took me all day. I learned an important lesson that day: it's relatively easy to tear something apart, but very difficult to put it back together. As I fretted and agonized over each part, I kept thinking about how different my experience was than the person who tore it apart. I imagined how easy it must have been — I imagined that it must have required very little thought or skill. I dare say it may have been fun. In contrast, my task before me was difficult and complex, requiring great thought and care. People are like that too.

It's so much easier to tear a person down than to build one up. It may even be quite satisfying... giving that person just what they "deserve." Stoking the fires of anger and self-righteousness within my spirit feels really good at the moment. Grappling at the image of another person, pulling them down into the mire of sorrow is so very immediately rewarding. "She had it coming," we declare with a sniff. I smile inwardly as another person above me is toppled – I must look higher now by comparison. Sadly, the satisfying feelings are temporary.

Anyone can claw and tear at another person. People are like airplanes. It takes no skill to decimate another's reputation. A well-placed word of negativity or a knowing smile accompanied with a lift of an eyebrow directed toward a sympathetic accomplice can do the trick to disassemble our victim's reputation and standing among my friends. How much more difficult and complex to build each other up? There's the real trick! Jesus might have been a great aircraft mechanic because he was great at building people up. He was an expert at finding the cast down parts of a person's spirit, unskillfully rent apart by some thoughtless person, and putting them back together once more, usually better than before. It takes a Creator to reassemble a person.

God made us in His image. That means a lot of things, but in this case I think it means that we are to be creators, not destroyers. What the serpent wrecked, the Creator repaired. What Satan tore down, the Creator built up. What the adversary injured, the Creator healed. We are not made in the image of the enemy, but of God. God creates, builds, and restores. Having been made in His image, I must do the same.

Did you ever notice that the Bible never mentions that Satan rests? There is no Sabbath rest for the Destroyer – why would he need one? Tearing down takes very little effort. If you find yourself building people up this week... you know, like the Creator... you will no doubt find that it's far more complex and perhaps taxing on our energies. Enjoy the Sabbath after the work of building up, just like our Father!
