What Happened to Patience?

"I'm not a patient person." I occasionally hear well-intentioned people say this sentence. In context, it's usually stated as if this particular absence of the quality is somehow virtuous. In other words, the confessed absence of patience is perceived to be synonymous with "getting things done" or efficiency. This "admission" of not being patient bothers me. What ever happened to the virtuous component of patience? It seems as though our culture rewards the person who lacks patience and penalizes the person who has it as if patience were akin to inefficiency or sluggishness. I do not believe this is true.

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness, and self-control. Against such things there is no law." Galatians 5:22-23

Patience seems to have gotten a bad reputation in our culture. We love to "admit" to not being patient as if the absence is somehow virtuous. It's curious to me that we don't do that with other fruits of the Spirit. No one likes to say "I'm not a faithful person." If they do, it's likely a genuine confession rather than a back-handed way of implying a personal strength as if being faithful indicates a weakness. "I'm not a loving person," "I'm not a joyful person," "I'm not a good person"... nope, these just don't work. Our culture (even within the church) has gradually begun to eschew patience, subtly turning it into a vice rather than a virtue. So why pick on patience?

I wonder if in our fast-pace culture we have collectively capitulated to our inability to be patient. We want our computers faster, we sigh at the person in front of us when the light turns green, we want our mail orders to arrive within two days — or better still, overnight. The danger is that we transpose this impatient attitude over to those around us. Change in the church doesn't come fast enough. Our children seem to learn things too slowly. People change their minds at a glacial rate. Someone does me wrong and I have no patience with them! I want my way and I want it now!

This is not the way of the Spirit-filled Christian. We aren't given the option of choosing popular fruits of the Spirit over ones we find out of vogue. If we are living within the will of God, we will naturally develop patience as we become more like Him, for he is long-suffering... in other words, patient.

This year I would like to be more patient. I want to cringe and have heart pangs when I am forced to admit that I am not as patient as I need to be. Patience used to be a virtue. Perhaps it's time to bring it back.
