Dead last....by definition, this could be by a considerable margin. This phrase may strike a nerve from a painful memory. So do you consider it a triumph or defeat? The person who finishes "dead last" can be tagged as someone who loses by a landslide, or as a hero who chooses to finish the task, no matter what. It's all in the perception. It's all in the attitude. When we hear the announcer say, "and now...last but not least" it usually means they saved the best to emphasize a place of honor. In race settings, when someone gets lapped, some in the stands will tactfully turn away embarrassed; while other fans show the utmost respect to the last competitor who struggles across the line, giving a standing ovation and applauding as if the winner had just finished.

When my son was around 10, he attended a summer conditioning camp. I usually parked in the shade to watch the final minutes and invariably there would be one last running drill. One of these workouts proved quite memorable. Each camper was to run a series of sprints before getting water. As the boys lined up, I knew what would take place and I both cringed and smiled (with pride) at what my son was about to do. In a matter of minutes, the campers finished at their own pace and left the field to get water and leave. In the end, my son was the last one running. Other than the coach, there was no one else around. One of the fastest finishers was a teenager who crossed the line and wandered out of view. Suddenly he returned. Before I knew what was happening, this 7th grader was now striding right along side my son, encouraging him to finish. No fanfare, no one telling him to do it. As my eyes watered, I prayed a quick prayer of thanks for the sensitivity of this boy and for the sheer guts my son displayed in completing a task that was difficult for him. Last but not least.

During the running of the 400- meter race in the 1992 Olympics, Derek Remond, the British record holder tore his hamstring. Crying out in pain and disappointment he chose to finish what he started. On one leg, he was hopping around the final curve when the viewers saw an older man running past security to join his son and help him finish the race. As if breaking the world record, the crowd provided a deafening ovation of admiration to this athlete, even though he finished DEAD LAST.

Christ provided us the mindset that "the first shall be last and the last shall be first." He downplayed where people should sit at a banquet. He praised the underdogs and made sure the crown of glory was attainable for the first, last and everyone in between. One of my favorite lines in the movie Apollo 13, was when the mission commander corrected the naysayers of the failed mission by claiming just bringing back the astronauts "could be our finest hour." Mindset. "Last but not least" represents victory, not defeat! We are all precious in His sight. It doesn't matter to God what place you finish in life, just finish the race!
