Following the Spirit During Ground Zero

In the weeks leading up to Ground Zero, I was somewhat anxious. I thought the endeavor would be too unorganized and impromptu to be successful. It felt as if we were going into the mission "trip" blind, without even an idea of what kind of work we'd end up doing, if any. There were no assigned service projects because we were going door to door hoping that someone would give us some work to do. We had no idea if anyone would open their door to us.

On Sunday, the first day of Ground Zero, we were given a fairly large sum of money and simply told to go spend it on people. Without having been given a specific task, our work group took longer trying to figure out what we were going to do than to actually do it. We ended up buying flowers and gift cards and giving them to people outside of Wal-Mart and gas stations, as well as praying with them. I was shocked by how many people were surprised and filled with joy by our actions. We found out as we asked for prayer requests that a large percentage of these people were going through particularly hard times in their lives. They were immensely appreciative that people care about others enough to go out of their way (and certainly out of there comfort zone) to bless complete strangers.

The next day, when we knocked on doors to pray over people and to request work that we could do for them, I was somewhat discouraged to find that few people answered their doors. However, this small number of people we talked to was more than what I had expected, and our efforts managed to fill up the week with jobs. It ended up being a good amount of work, and the work was very much appreciated.

As the week went on, it occurred to me that despite its spontaneous nature, the mission trip was going very well. Throughout the rest of the mission trip, I pondered how this could be. In time, I came to the conclusion that perhaps the success of Ground Zero wasn't *in spite of* its spontaneity, but *because* of it. The Holy Spirit can work through people, and our creating a strict schedule may interfere with the Spirit's work. If we allow room for the Spirit to work through us, then it becomes easier to be a part of God's plan. I believe it was God's plan to put those people in need in our path. I learned that the Spirit leads to better things than our human-made plans could.

The phrase, "however the Spirit moves me" is often taken lightly, and is even used jokingly by some; however, the Holy Spirit should be seriously considered and should be allowed to work through us. It is often hard to relinquish control and entrust our plans to the Spirit. It sometimes even means that we will do things we don't want to do or are uncomfortable doing, but the Holy Spirit will always lead to the betterment of God's kingdom and the furthering of His plans.
