## My Art Stinks

A couple of weeks ago I took my daughter to Abilene's Children's Arts & Literacy Festival (CALF). It was great! We listened to dramatic readings of books, saw a magic show, watched the unveiling of a new sculpture downtown, saw some impressive art from a children's book illustrator, listened to some wonderful music, had some great pizza for lunch, and saw many wonderful friends who were also attending the CALF. Whew!

I love art. I love it for many reasons, but one reason I love it is for what it teaches. Art teaches one how to objectively evaluate an object or an idea. I once had a student suggest that no one could define art. I guess that statement was intended to make him sound wise, but I told him that I could define art and, indeed, many people have defined art. There might be many definitions; however, the best ones have much in common. Good art makes the unknown, known. Or as some would say, it makes the esoteric, exoteric. In order to do that we must have the ability to objectively evaluate objects or ideas. This book is "good" while this one is "bad." In our culture we cringe when someone suggests that there are inherent "good" or "bad" qualities in anything. "Who are you to judge?" Well, I'm a human being, made in the image of God. That's who I am.

Art celebrates judgement and teaches us to judge. There is a reason why my illustrations weren't being featured at the CALF... my illustrations aren't good. Now there are many kind people who would look at one of my drawings and smile sweetly at my effort, but realistically, my illustrations stink. I have extensive training in literature. I can read literature and tell you not just if it's good, but why it is good (or bad). I may like it or not (a very subjective opinion) but whether it's inherently "good" or not is not subject to my opinion, but relies upon an objective evaluation of the artifact's inherent qualities. Art trains the mind to make such judgements. Actions and ideas operate in the same manner, despite what our culture preaches.

Why is this ability to judge important? It's important because, as humans, we must make judgements every day. If I have no right to judge an action (as claimed by many today) then how can I make a judgement regarding that action for myself? Logically, I can't. Thus, the claim that we can't make judgements is not only false, but illogical. The World bombards us with this ridiculous message of non-judgement continuously despite that fact that they judge all the time. The real question is the measure by which we judge. Does everyone get to come up with their own standard? Were that the case, then there would truly be no standard and we are back to an illogical conclusion. I suggest that God is the standard. He has revealed his will in the Bible and it is not nearly as subjective as people may think. We, as humans made in the image of God, can think and reason and read and understand the Bible, applying it to ourselves and our lives. If we don't have this ability, why does art exist?
