## Therefore, Go!

As a Christian, you have good news of what Jesus has done for you and that news could change people's lives if only they hear it and accept it. Jesus spoke to the Eleven in Matthew 28:18-20," All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the father and of the son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always to the very end of the age."

So now that the Eleven are gone, who is Jesus calling to "therefore go"? I'm reminded of Isaiah's vision in Isaiah 6:8 when the Lord says, "Who shall we send and who will go?" Isaiah says, "Here am I, send me." Isaiah was very bold! He wasn't like Jonah who did everything he could to avoid God's command to preach, and he wasn't like Moses who tried to convince God he had the wrong man, but he simply said, "Here am I, send me."

We also see from the early Christians in Acts 8:4 that when the Christians were scattered they preached the word wherever they went. We are investing in souls. As stated in Mark 8:36, "What good is it for a man to gain the whole world and yet forfeit his soul." Whether we take the message to a foreign land or we share it right here on Abilene soil, we are investing in souls. Do you have the attitude of Isaiah, "Here am I send me"? Good leadership in guiding us in the work of sharing what Jesus has done for us is great, but leadership is not a substitute for us to "therefore go."

I was afforded the opportunity to go to Mumena, Zambia, this past summer. In John 4:35, Jesus says, "the fields are ripe for harvest" - I've seen plenty of corn fields ripe for harvest back in Illinois, but I never had a good visual of people being ripe for harvest into God's kingdom until I went to Mumena. The people were eager to hear the Word of God and received the message with great enthusiasm. The most beautiful picture of a ripe harvest I have ever seen! Twenty-eight were baptized into the name of the father, the son, and the Holy Spirit and are currently being taught by the churches in Mumena to obey everything that Jesus commanded. Praise God!

"Are we focusing too much on foreign missions and neglecting local missions?" is a question I've heard asked at Hillcrest. In Acts 11:19-26; 13:1-3; 15:35 we read about the great example of the Antioch church and their effectiveness in local missions, but also their passion and commitment to foreign missions. We don't see them sacrificing one for the other, but instead they had great zeal for both.

Hillcrest, in the past and present, has great passion and leadership in foreign missions. This is a rare combination in our brotherhood, and I strongly believe that God is leading this work. One day we will hear him say, "Well done, good and faithful servants."

You might be able to relate in some ways to Moses, Jonah, or Isaiah. I believe one of the most important things to notice in all these examples is not as much their initial reaction, but their eventual response. They all went. So "therefore go."
