TO GROW WHERE I AM PLANTED

"Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow . . ." Matthew 6:28 KJV

This scripture is often quoted as a reminder not to worry—God is present. He cares about the lilies and ravens. He clothes and feeds them and will care for us, too. It is comforting and hopeful.

However, there is more to consider about the lilies of the field. A few years ago, I was praying regularly trying to discern God's will for me. I was debating job opportunities and the impact various opportunities would have on me and our family. I was praying that God would guide me and I would make the choice that was in His will. Then, during my morning devotional**, this phrase jumped off the page "they grow where they are put." It caught my full attention. I paused and reread it.

When I consider the lilies of the field, I had never considered where they grow. The lilies of the field grow wherever they are planted. Some grow in gardens to be admired. Others grown along stretches of highways and are seen by thousands travelling that route. We often think of how beautiful the flowers are that we see and we praise God for caring about the lilies and caring about us.

But, let's consider the lilies that grow in fields unseen by anyone. There are fields where no roads go through and there is no access for people to view. The lilies growing in those fields may never be seen by anyone or, at best, by only a few. And, yet, they grow and are arrayed in beauty just like the ones seen every day by lots of people. God cares for them as he does for the ones seen daily.

Do you ever feel unseen?

Do you think you need to wait for the right time or place to live faithfully as His disciple?

Do you ever think of the things you could do for God, if only He would put you in that job, or give you the spouse you've been praying for, or the children you so desperately want?

If so, you are like me. It is comforting to know that you can serve God in whatever role you are in. God wants us to consider the lilies and simply grow where we are planted.
