## **Lessons from a Shot Clock Operator**

After an unforgettable job as a basketball coach at ACU, I found myself missing the adrenaline rush of a close game and having the best seat in the house. Fortunately, I landed a new front row seat at half court as the Shot Clock Operator. From this perch, I can hear bits and pieces of "coach speak," officials reporting fouls, and look into the eyes of players checking into the game. I love this job and have done it for 17 years. It is my job to be invisible during a game and apply the rules subjectively until the final buzzer sounds. If I do my job correctly, the game runs seamlessly. I don't usually get any feedback - except for an occasional "thumbs up" from an official who agrees with my interpretation of a tricky situation during a game - or if I mess up. When this happens, the whole game stops and I have to reset my shot clock (kind of embarrassing and super motivation to always do my best).

This year, before the first men's game, our reliable table crew (score book, game clock, scoreboard, replay and shot clock) went to meet with the officials. During this meeting, the officials check in with us and go over any rule changes. It was in this meeting that something new happened. The first words from the lead official were, "who is running the shot clock?" I replied that I was. He said we had some changes and the whole crew nodded our heads in recognition. Then he asked me directly to tell his crew how I interpreted the new rules. Wow! Talk about being put on the spot! Fortunately, my answer sufficed.

Have <u>you</u> ever had an opportunity to explain why you do what you do in life? Do our words and actions take on a "world" interpretation (self-centered, instant gratification, try to get ahead mindset)? In comparison, I think Jesus lived life in a way that mimics a shot clock buzzer. His actions and words stopped people in their tracks and made them think about what just happened and why He would do what He did.

While listening to Nathan a few Sundays ago, I started thinking about what I am doing on a daily basis that <u>demonstrates</u> my love for Jesus. When we love someone, we usually see some type of public display of affection...kindness in our eyes, handholding, hugs, words of affirmation, doing nice things for the one we love, putting their needs before our own, etc. So if we love someone, we <u>demonstrate</u> with our actions and tell them with our words. Further, if we are in love, we almost always <u>share</u> our happiness with others and <u>brag</u> about what that person means in our life. As Christians, do we stay ready to explain why we do what we do? In John 14:15, Jesus says, "If you love me, keep my commandments" which includes loving God and loving your neighbor. In the end, if done correctly, we will earn far greater than a "thumbs up" from our Father. As I strive to boldly interpret God's commands in my daily life, I can use a re-written familiar song with a John 13:35 vibe to encourage a public display of affection for the one I love.

I love Jesus, people know For my words and actions show His joy and peace in me abide. The Word of God will be my guide.
